*Dr. Alexander Haselkorn is a Rutgers University '61 and Hahnemann Medical College of Philadelphia/Drexel University '65 graduate. Internship and first year surgical residency were at Albert Einstein/Bronx Municipal Hospital. Senior Surgical residency and Chief Residency in Surgery were at Beth Israel Medical Center in New York City. He was a Swanson Hand Fellow at Blodget Hospital/Michigan State University.*

*Dr. Haselkorn has practiced at Barnert Hospital for thirty-five years. Originally a General Surgeon, his practice is limited now to Hand Surgery. By virtue of his long tenure at Barnert Hospital and practice in Paterson, he has become one of the most well-known and recognizable people not only at Barnert but in the city of Paterson. By conservative estimate Dr. Haselkorn has performed 7,000 surgical procedures making him the most prolific surgeon in the nearly one hundred-year history of Barnert. Although also on the staff at Chilton Hospital and St. Mary's Hospital, Dr. Haselkorn is most closely identified as a Barnert specialist.*

*Dr. Haselkorn has served as a chairman of the Department of Surgery and President of the medical staff. He is currently Chief of the Louis and Edith Service at Barnert Hospital.*

*About twelve years ago, Dr. Haselkorn wrote the protocol and founded the hand service at Barnert Hospital. Eight years ago the Barnert Hospital Board of Trustee honored Dr. Haselkorn by proclaiming the Hand Service the Louis and Edith Haselkorn Hand Service honoring Dr. Haselkorn's parents. Now the Louis and Edith Haselkorn Hand Service at Barnert Hospital is the number one hospital Hand Service in the region and probably in the State of New Jersey, both in number of cases and complexity of cases. The Louis and Edith Haselkorn Hand Service is on target to perform at least 300 cases this year.*

*Dr. Haselkorn and his wife Roberta have produced the successful DVD "Say Goodbye to Wrist Pain" now in its fifth reproduction.*
